- Lectures
 - Straightforward
 - We have a better understanding of successes and failures
- Seminars
 - Nobody is sure about how good ones look like
 - We do not have a good understanding of what causes their success or failure
 - More complex forms of teaching/learning practice

MATERIAL PREPARATION & TIPS



- Make sure that you know what you want to achieve out of discussion!
- Prepare alternative sets of plans/questions/activities for discussion!
- Know the level and expectations of your students!
- If possible know the name of your students!



MATERIAL PREPARATION & TIPS

- Arrange the room and physical environment







- WAIT! Give students time to respond...
- Do not always answer the questions immediately...
 - Ask it to other students: "What do you think?"
